- 4. Only applications from within Free State will be considered.
- All interested officials need to apply online at https://www.eservices.gov.za/ (Process attached) NO APPLICATIONS PER HAND OR ANY OTHER METHOD will be accepted.
- 6. Applications open on 1 May 2025 and close on the 31 July 2025.
- 7. No late applications will be accepted.
- Candidates that qualify will be invited to write a literacy test from 6 to 10 October 2025.
- Successful applicants will be informed between 1 and 11 December 2025.
- 10. First years will start with registration and orientation on 12 January 2026.

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1. Requirements

1.1 Higher Certificate in Auxiliary Nursing (R169) (One year)

Candidates will be required to meet the following criteria:

Admission requirements for applicants who matriculated 2008 and after

- Matric Certificate or equivalent thereof (National Senior Certificate)
- AP score 23 and above. Maximum of 6 subjects + Life Orientation will be calculated (See table 1)
- Life Orientation count as 1 irrespective of the level obtained
- English level 4 (50-59%) and above
- Life Science level 4 (50-59%) and above
- Mathematic Literacy level 4 (50-59%) or Mathematics level 3 (40-49%) and above
- Preference will be given to candidates with Physical Science

Admission requirements for applicants who matriculated before 2008

- Matric Certificate or equivalent thereof
- M-Score 20 and above. Maximum of 6 subjects will be calculated (See table 2)
- English HG (50%, D symbol) or SG (60%, C symbol) and above
- Biology or Physiology HG (50%, D symbol) or SG (60%, C symbol) and above
- Preference will be given to candidates with Mathematics and / or Physical Science

1.2 Diploma in Nursing (R171) (Three years)

Candidates will be required to meet the following criteria:

Admission requirements for applicants who matriculated 2008 and after

- Matric Certificate or equivalent thereof (National Senior Certificate)
- AP score 25 and above. Maximum of 6 subjects + Life Orientation will be calculated (See table 1)
- Life Orientation count as 1 irrespective of the level obtained
- English level 4 (50-59%) and above
- Mathematic Literacy level 4 (50-59%) or Mathematics level 3 (40-49%) and above
- Life Science level 4 (50-59%) and above
- Preference will be given to candidates with Physical Science



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Admission requirements for applicants who matriculated before 2008

- Matriculation Exemption or equivalent thereof
- M-Score 23 and above. Maximum of 6 subjects will be calculated (See table 2)
- A minimum of two subjects on higher grade
- English HG (50%, D symbol) or SG (60%, C symbol) and above
- Mathematics HG (40%, E symbol) or SG (50%, D symbol) or Commercial Mathematics SG (50% D symbol) and above
- Biology or Physiology HG (50%, D symbol) and above or SG (60%, C symbol) and above
- Preference will be given to candidates with Physical Science

1.3 Advanced Diploma in Midwifery (R1497) (One Year)

Candidates will be required to meet the following criteria:

Admission requirements for applicants

- Matric Certificate or equivalent thereof (National Senior Certificate)
- Diploma in Nursing on NQF level 6 (R683 or R171 will be acceptable)
- Registration as a General Nurse at the South African Nursing Council (SANC) proof to be uploaded
- Staff of the Department of Health MUST follow study leave policy together with the application as study leave will be a requirement
- Private students may apply but will be required to pay private fees at own cost

2. Recognition of prior learning (RPL)

2.1 Higher Certificate in Auxiliary Nursing (R169) (One year)

- Nursing related course and / or nursing experience
- Study leave recommendation / approval, if an employee
- National Senior Certificate or equivalent
- M-Score (before 2008) 17 points
- AP Score (2008 and after) 20 points

Subjects: English

Any one of: Life sciences / Biology / Physiology / Physical science

Recommended: Mathematics / Mathematical Literacy / Commercial Mathematics

ALT test result of 40% and above

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2.2 Diploma in Nursing (R171) (Three years)

- SANC Registration as Enrolled Nurse / Auxiliary nurse
- Study leave recommendation / approval, if an employee
- National Senior Certificate or equivalent
- M-Score (before 2008) 20 points
- AP Score (2008 and after) 22 points

Subjects: English

Any one of: Life sciences / Biology / Physiology / Physical science

Recommended: Mathematics / Mathematical Literacy / Commercial Mathematics

ALT of 45% and above

2.3 Process for RPL

- ALL RPL candidates need to apply online.
- 1 May 2025 system opens for online applications.
- 31 July 2025 system closes.
- 29 August 2025 screening of all programs to be completed.
- Candidates who may qualify for RPL will get a message on online application as well as the
 application form to complete.
- Completed application form must be submitted online and as part of the Portfolio of Evidence at nearest campus.
- End of September all RPL portfolios must be submitted.
- Portfolio of Evidence must include:
 - A completed application form
 - Indication whether employed or unemployed
 - A formal written application letter with a motivation why applicant must be selected
 - Certified copies of documents (ID, senior certificate, qualifications etc.)
 - Motivation from manager or previous manager/ supervisor
 - Study leaves recommendation or approval
- ALT will be written 6 to 10 October 2025.
- RPL assessment will be arranged with those who qualify.
- RPL portfolios will be evaluated by RPL committees and must be completed by end October.
- ALT percentages to be captured by 07 November 2025 but no score will be made available to candidates as many criteria is combined for final decision by selection committees.
- The selection committees will be responsible for the selection of RPL candidates.
- 10 % of each campus intake will be RPL candidates:
 - o Eastern Campus: 4
 - o Northern Campus: 6
 - Southern Campus: 6
 - o 3 per campus for R169
